The war in Ukraine has evoked so many powerful images. When a photograph or video can be shared in real time it brings the rest of the world to that place. A few of the images over the past couple of weeks that have moved many of us include the line of empty strollers donated by families at the train station in Poland, waiting for arriving Ukrainian parents to be able to safely place their little ones after the long journey from their homeland to a new life in a foreign land. Then there was the video this past week of a lone cellist, Oleksandr Osipov, performing Bach in front of bombed out buildings in Kharkiv. And then just this weekend, the image of a line of Jews praying, leaning on the Wall of the Planet in Jerusalem, as their ancestors had for two thousand years. But for the first time since the Holocaust, they wore a draped flag over their shoulders. It was not their own flag but instead the flag of Ukraine as they raised their prayers for peace.

Imagery is what has carried our Christian tradition to us in such a vivid way. As we approach Holy Week and Easter, we will once again remember the story of those events of Jesus' final days and death and resurrection with objects and practices that help us tell the familiar story all over again. On April 10, at our Service, we will replace the Lenten display of desert plants, rocks, and sand with fanned out palms and we will wave palms from the pews to take us back to Jesus' glorious entrance into Jerusalem. On Maundy Thursday, our imagery will turn to the water and towel with which Jesus humbled himself to wash his disciples' feet. At our 7:00 p.m. Service on April 14 we will also recall the Last Supper with the Service of Holy Communion and end with the story being told in parts as more and more light is extinguished. A bare sanctuary on Good Friday is intended to provide a space without distraction for quiet reflection and prayer between 9:00am and 3:00 p.m.

Then, on Easter Morning, the glory of the Risen Christ will be welcomed just as the sun rises when we gather outside on the grounds of the Mack Corporate Headquarters at 6:15 a.m. followed by a continental breakfast in Bailey Hall. The flowers and glorious music of the 10:00 a.m. Service of Worship will be our way of expressing deep and heartfelt joy through beauty, with extra meaning attached having not had the opportunity to worship in the church sanctuary for the last two Easter Sundays.

Through the power of Zoom, we also are able to share these images and experiences beyond our four walls. As we move toward and beyond the cross, consider which images have been with you, allowing your mind to take you to places that you hold sacred. May the vision of all that God makes possible be a blessing.

The Federated Church of East Arlington will once again be offering "Bentley Family Scholarships." The Bentley Scholarship Fund was established by the Trust of June A. Bentley who taught both music and business in Arlington schools and who believed in developing the potential that each of us has within us.

Anyone who lives in Arlington, Sandgate, or Sunderland, or who went to Arlington Memorial High School, and will be attending college or graduate school in the Fall of 2022 is welcome to apply.

<u>"7 Things you should never say in church"</u>

Take the Pledge!

Over the course of many conversations with church leaders, I hear some phrases that make me cringe. So below is a whimsical, but I hope truthful collection of phrases that I never want you to say in church. I hope you will take the pledge to never repeat these!

- 1) "Everyone I know goes to church": With less than 20% of people in this country going to church anywhere, it is a statement that usually reflects a fear of invitation. If it is true for members, then they need to get out and expand their circle of acquaintances.
- 2) <u>"I remember when...":</u> This is usually followed by a litany of stories about a previous pastor or what life was like in 1955. Jesus said we can't look back and plow the field (Luke 9:62). We have to look forward to be be effective today.
- 3) "I can't wait until we resume the (rummage sale, church fair, Apple Blossom festival, etc.): Most of these large, fund-raising events take up tons of time and energy and do very little to further the mission of the church. We couldn't do these events during Covid, why re-start them?
- 4) "I don't pledge to the church but I give my time": We should give our time and talent, but Jesus reminded us that our treasure and our heart are intertwined. Even if we can only give the "widow's mite", we need to give financially for our own spiritual growth.
- 5) <u>"Let's get back to "real" worship in person":</u> Most of the world is online and if we are going to connect with people we need to be there as well. Online worship is real worship and if we do it well, it will help people grow in faith.
- 6) <u>"Wouldn't you like that 8 year term on stewardship (or C.E. or whatever"):</u>
 More and more churches are streamlining their church structure, so that people may engage in ministry, rather than talking about ministry.
- 7) "Why can't we just sing all of the old hymns?": As one writer said, listen to the Top 40 songs of today, listen to your hymns and then ask why younger generations aren't engaged by your worship.

So, will you take the pledge with me to never say these 7 things in church? Your ministry and mission will be stronger for it.


