Summer is extravagant and over-stated and showy.

Summer colors are bright and gaudy and over-the-top.

Summer life is abundant and prolific and overwhelming.

Yet summer riots it colors loudest where sun and showers combine to ring out the glory.

I love that in this piece titled "Summer Is Extravagant" by Marjorie Dobson, what sets summer apart as well as unites it with other seasons is a sense of intensity. Summer's heat has the power to quiet us enough to seek out shade and coolness and maybe even a nap while also stirring up strong feelings and short tempers.

Throughout history, some of the most memorable events came during this hot season. Those that come to mind from my childhood include the 1963 March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom, the Apollo 11 lunar landing with Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin taking the first human steps on the moon, and the Woodstock music festival that I was too young to attend. These were happening while I was doing what kids do in the heat of summer – go swimming, stay out past dark, ride bikes, and explore the neighborhood – all for as long as we wanted but with the explicit expectation that we would

be home for dinner. And in the very hot week leading up to and through the 4<sup>th</sup> of July in 1993, my very pregnant body sought out relief anywhere it could be found. The heat wave of that week made me grateful to spend 4 days in the hospital giving birth and recuperating and getting to know my newborn daughter in the comfort of an almost empty air-conditioned maternity wing at SVMC.

When we think of the extravagance that summer presents, we can't help but give thanks for the splashes of color, the ever-growing gardens big and small, the welcome breezes, and the lapping of rivers, streams, and lakes we are surrounded by here in our corner of God's world. Dwelling in such extravagance while quieting ourselves to God's call, gives us time and space to consider how we will serve God and God's people. Summer affords us time to reflect on what we will do with our voices and our resources to further the causes of mercy and justice that cry out to us.

Amid the drone of insects and the varied singing voices of birds, may we carve out moments for extravagant listening. God is still speaking.
