I have finally gotten used to the idea that in times of celebration or grief or simply sharing a meal, I am considered the professional pray-er. It comes with the job of pastor, and I embrace the honor – most of the time. Occasionally, I become self-conscious, such as the time I was in Hannaford and was asked to pray in the cereal aisle. I quickly realized, though, that the one for whom I was praying was in strong need of prayer and that, to be honest, no one was really paying much attention to us.

This week's deadly shooting at Robb Elementary School in Texas brought many of us to our knees and filled us with a profound sadness. I know my prayers were spilling over with questions. "How long will this continue, God?" "What would you have us do and feel so as not to become hard of heart?" "What can I do to be the change I wish to see in this world, Holy One?" I was reminded that in my favorite of the Epistles, James points out that "Faith without works is dead."

Prayer is the beginning, not the end. I offer then the words of another. This blessing is from Kate Bowler, Duke Divinity School professor and the author of *Good Enough*, which we used for our Lenten Book Study this year.

A Blessing for Collective Grief (When Thoughts and Prayers Are Not Enough)

This world.

Impossible.

Unthinkable.

We are brought to our knees.

God, today, there is no true north.

And when I last checked,

the sun did not rise at all.

Today, the innocent still suffer,

teachers still risk their lives,

families still grieve.

A world has ended without

any reasonable fanfare.

And we are sold the fantasy that nothing can be done.

Help us to know what to feel - rage, grief, sorrow.

And what to do – advocate, protest, lament.

Blessed are we who let reality in,

though our bodies shudder.

Blessed are we who ask and wait and ask again

for the courage to change our culture

whose laws and complicity subsidize death.

God, give us hope that seems hard to find.

When we are at a loss for the right words <u>and</u> our next action, may we lean into our ever-present God for guidance and wisdom and courage.

- All of us enjoyed summer services outdoors but we've been borrowing tents. The church council has authorized the purchase of our own tent, which we'll use for Sunday services if the weather is nice but also make available to other not-for-profits in our area to use in our own inviting lawn.
- We've been borrowing audio/visual equipment making Zoom services possible. During the COVID crisis, all of us experienced Zoom church. Now, our shut in members want and need to continue to attend Sunday services online. We're aiming at equipment flexible enough for all our needs.
- ◆ Dunlap Hall, once the Methodist church, has no bathroom. We'd like to start the plumbing process by installing a septic system.
- ♦ New railings for the front of the church.

Our target is \$20,000. I hope we can get 100% participation from the congregation. You'll hear from me soon.
