I write this while looking out at the still beautiful but fading fall colors along Ice Pond Road and the mountain beyond with my thoughts already turning to Advent. Maybe that's because this year it begins on the Sunday of Thanksgiving weekend, and we can pretty much predict that our airwaves and newspapers and store shelves will be marching toward Christmas with a fury before the Halloween candy is eaten.

This Advent and Christmas season we will be focusing here at the Federated Church of East Arlington on angels. The theme for each week's Worship as well as the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day (on a Sunday this year) Services will be "Angels Among Us." Each week we will explore the role that angels play in proclaiming the good news before and after the birth of Jesus. We will also devote our Advent Friday Book Study via Zoom to the book *The Angels* of Christmas by Susan Robb. If vou would like a copy of the book ordered for you, please let me know via phone or email by **Sunday**, **November 6**. The cost of the book is \$17.00.

Of course, angels will also appear in two of our traditional Advent/Christmas celebrations. There will be an angel to create on **Sunday, December 4 from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m.** as part of our beloved Advent Workshop. We will also keep our eyes open for an angel or two on **Sunday, December 18** at our Christmas Pageant during the 10:00 a.m. Service of Worship.

You, too, will have the opportunity to be another type of angel by picking up a **Red Stocking**, available beginning Wednesday, Nov., 23rd or pick up on Sunday, Nov. 27th, to then buy and wrap a Christmas gift for a child here in our community. Attach the red stocking to the wrapped package and return on or before December 11th.

Let us hold dear then these words from the French poet and statesman, Alphonse de Lamartine, "To love for the sake of being loved is human, but to love for the sake of loving is angelic."



AdventWord releases daily prompt words for 2022!

Forward Movement has announced the 2022 reflection words for AdventWord, a global online advent calendar and community of disciples. For nearly a decade AdventWord has inspired followers of Jesus who wish to add an accessible prayer practice to their daily routine during this holy season.

Daily meditations and images—inspired by a prompt word selected from the daily lectionary readings—will be released at **adventword.org**, beginning Sunday, November 27.

Participants can sign up to receive this daily message, in English and Spanish, by email or by following Advent-Word on social media.

Many followers join the creativity each year by sharing their own personal reflections across social media using #AdventWord. Participants respond with photos, written responses, crafts, drawings, poems, found art, and other creative expressions inspired by the day's selected word.

"This year we enlisted volunteer community members to help with the selection of prompt words from the daily lectionary readings," said Richelle Thompson, managing editor at Forward Movement. "The online gathering of dozens of AdventWord community members was an inspiring way to kick off the planning for 2022 and a strong reminder that AdventWord is community-driven."

Pastor Search Committee Update

The pastor search committee has been meeting regularly since late August.

Members Donna Stone, Karen Tibbetts, Karen Underhill, and Christy Wood have been plowing through lots of preliminaries and gathering data so we can develop a job description and package on our church for prospective candidates.

We've been attending to what kind of minister we want, too. That, of course, is a question for the entire congregation.

To that end, we're assembling focus groups for November and early December.

Each member of the church will be invited to a discussion group of about eight people facilitated by two search committee members. The groups will meet in Bailey Hall. We're aiming for an open conversation lasting 90 minutes or so and addressing the following questions:

What gives you satisfaction at church?

What are our strengths and challenges?

Who are we as a church family, and who is God calling us to be?

What qualities are you looking for in a minister?

In the next week or so, everyone will get an invitation to a session. We want to keep the groupings small but we also want everyone's opinion. Rest assured, then, they'll be flexibility if you can't make the date on your invitation. Since some members are shut-ins, we'll be doing personal visits here and there.

We're scheduling two groups, one on November 13 and the other on November 20 to occur right after church. We'll schedule others in the next few days, aiming at different times to accommodate those for whom Sunday morning isn't best. Onward and upward!

21st TSC Chaplains Keep Coffee and Conversation Flowing with Holy Joe's

The 21st Theater Sustainment Command Chaplain, Col. Stanton Trotter, knows how to get Soldiers' attention. He tries to always have candy at his desk, donuts at special events, and hot coffee wherever chaplains are near.

"Many times a Soldier will come for a cup a coffee to a coffee ministry sponsored by a chaplain and pour a fresh cup of coffee, linger over the joy of the libation, and then turn to the chaplain and say, 'Chaplain, as long as I am here, I would like talk with you about something. Do you have a minute?'" said Trotter.

The 21st TSC chaplains got a boost to their coffee supply last month, from the nonprofit organization Holy Joe's, which donated 16 pallets of coffee for distribution throughout Germany and forward operating sites in Poland.

Trotter and Holy Joe's have a decade-long track record, going back to when Trotter was deployed to Afghanistan in 2012, and Holy Joe's supplied coffee for the Spiritual Resiliency Center at Bagram Air Base.

Thousands of free cups of Holy Joe's coffee are served to U.S. troops in 70 countries throughout the world each day. Holy Joe's founder and executive director Thomas Jastermsky estimates they have supplied more than two billion cups of coffee to Soldiers, Airmen, Sailors, Marines, Special Forces and the Coast Guard since their modest beginnings in 2006.

"We are happy to be of service through the chaplains," said Jastermsky. "It's more than just a cup of coffee. People can connect with the chaplains if they are going through something heavy, and know that it will be confidential. It also lets Service Members know that people back home are thinking of them."

Jastermsky added that Holy Joes allows individuals and organizations that do not necessarily have a military affiliation, show their support for Service Members and their families. "As a civilian, it's my way of giving back," he said, acknowledging the tremendous support Holy Joe's receives from businesses that share that commitment.

It is a commitment that keeps coffee and conversations flowing.

"Think of the amount of connections this will allow for chaplains to talk with soldiers in many coffee connection ministries," said Trotter. "Holy Joe's, and all of the corporations that donate goods and services, continue to be a blessing to our chaplains and Soldiers."
