

Bishop Peggy A. Johnson NEUMC

Bishop Johnson will lead the New England United Methodist Conference beginning January 1, 2023. She has a connection to Vermont as her college roommate lives in Vermont, she attended a College of Bishops' learning event and she is a fan of Ben & Jerry's ice cream.

Bishop Johnson served 20 years at Christ UMC of the deaf in Baltimore and represents the Council of Bishops on the denomination's Committee on Disability Ministries. After 10 years as an active bishop, she retired in 2021. She and her spouse, Rev. Mary Johnson have two sons and 2 grandchildren.

Although she will serve for only 18 months she is clear about her role: "I want to prepare this Conference for the next bishop in 2024, so that it can move forward in some even healthier ways and healed ways" she said.

Bishop Johnson loves to preach and lead Bible studies, sees importance of prayer, is passionate about youth, children and young adults, and is passionate about collaborative work with laity.

She said she knows the work is not easy, but she remains confident about our success.

"Church is not a walk in the park, it's a war zone sometimes. We are waging war against the powers and principalities that want to take us down, want to divide us, want to look at us as irrelevant. We have the power of the Holy Spirit to turn this world upside down, I believe that with all my heart" said Bishop Johnson.
