### Meditation, Meanderings, and Musings from Pastor Kathy

Balloons maybe.

If Jesus were coming here,

maybe we'd line up on either side of his parade route, and wave balloons as he passed.

Back and forth...a multitude of colors,

and we'd probably shout Yeah! Instead of Hosanna,

and we'd hold up homemade posters saying,

"Welcome, Jesus!"

and as he passed by...probably in one of those bubble-top cars

because the FBI would not want to be left out of this one...

On the other hand maybe he'd refuse and ride that donkey after all

or maybe even walk down the middle of the road with balloons bobbing

as he walked, and he'd wave to us and bless us.

And we'd follow, and follow, and follow.

What a celebration! What a festival of Faith that would be!

And when the parade passed by, we'd finally go home, and look forward to the celebration next Sunday.

But what about Holy Week?

The days lengthen

The pear tree flowers white outside my kitchen window...

In the mysterious Lenten mix of lament and hope the taunting, blood-splattered

face of war screams into our lives,

and we are tempted to despair.

The TV bleeds and explodes

 $and\ the\ unspeakably\ obscene\ inhumanity\ of\ war$ 

blares into our ears and our hearts -

and we turn and run.

the same wall we visit each Lent –
trying to get around a Gate called Truth,
trying to go from Palm Sunday
straight to Easter morning,
trying to keep from going into that courtyard
where we must answer whether we know him or not,
trying to keep from going anywhere near that cross.
So give us the palms and give us a parade,
but O God, whisk us right from Palm Sunday
to that "great getting-up morning."

Have our Easter baskets filled and waiting for us, O God,

because this year we're tired and we're scared and we just want a little peace and quiet. And so we turn and run

or we kneel and pray for mercy and for miracles and the eyes to see this Jesus named Emmanuel,

the eyes to see that God is with us.

As we consider the power of these words of the writer Ann Weems with their complex mixture of hope and despair, pain and glory, the awful and the beautiful in this poem titled From Hosanna to Horror, the Only Road to Easter, I invite you to join us for the familiar journey through Holy Week beginning with Palm/Passion Sunday, ending with Sunrise and 10:00 a.m. Worship and all that happens in-between. The joy of the arrival at the destination of Resurrection only comes from our appreciation for all that it takes to get there.






Federated Church Scholarships Available to Local High School Graduates and Those Continuing Their Education

## **Building and Grounds Monthly Activity**

- 3/I Observed that vinyl siding is missing from area on front of sanctuary. Picked up pieces off the ground and placed in garage. Contacted Chris Legacy about repairs.
- 3/2 Met with Chris Legacy at church.
- 3/4 Shoveled snow from walkways. Noted that kitchen cupboards had been cleaned.
- 3/7 Obtained quote from Chris Legacy. Members of Buildings and Ground Committee concurred on proceeding with repair.
- 3/8 Gave Chris Legacy go-ahead for vinyl repair.
- 3/15 Measured outside areas of buildings to make a rough estimate of cost for replacing all vinyl siding. (Areas of windows and doors not included)

Sanctuary - 3400 sq.ft.

Baily Hall - 2400 sq. ft.

Dunlap Hall - 2800 sq. ft.

Parsonage and Garage - 2400 sq. ft.

Total - 11,000 sq. ft.

Add 10% for cutoff and scrap.

Purchase amount 12,000 sq. ft.

Vinyl costs approx. \$400 per box containing 200 sq. ft.

12000 sq. ft \* (\$400 / 200 sq. ft.) = \$24,000 for materials

Double the estimate for labor. (Based on Chris Legacy's repair quote)

Rough estimate to replace vinyl siding \$50,000

However, based on the fact that the painters wanted \$20,000 to paint the interior of the parsonage, this estimate may be too low.

- 3/17 Water in church basement approximately 6" deep. Problem with sump pump float switch. Got it to turn on by shaking.
- 3/18 Monthly meeting of church council. Pastor Clark recommended I contact Vt Health Dept. regarding lead paint.
- 3/19 Used lead test kit to confirm presence of lead in peeling paint on parsonage porch.
- 3/19 High water in church basement. Sump pump still not coming on on its own. Replaced float switch.
- 3/20 obtained quote from Chris Legacy for painting interior of parsonage.
- 3/22 Did a walk-through of parsonage for purpose of assessing if I could paint it myself.
- 3/24 High water. New pump switch no better than the old one.
- 3/24 Passed Health department class on "Inspection, Repair and Cleaning Practices" for buildings that contain lead paint.

there will be a continental breakfast of coffee, juice, and pastries in Bailey


