The Sun by Mary Oliver Have you ever seen anything in your life more wonderful

than the way the sun, every evening, relaxed and easy, floats toward the horizon

out of the blackness, every morning, on the other side of the world, like a red flower

streaming upward on its heavenly oils, say, on a morning in early summer, at its perfect imperial distance-- and have you ever felt for anything such wild love-- do you think there is anywhere, in any language, a word billowing enough for the pleasure

Summer Lunch Program It takes a village of volunteers!

The Arlington Area Summer Lunch Program begins on Tuesday, June 20, 2020 and runs through August th.

This program is designed to provide a week's worth of lunch food per child.

Volunteers order the food from Aldi's, as well as milk cards, ice cream cards and egg cards from Stewarts.

Volunteers call the families each week as a reminder to pick up the bags of food.

Volunteers pick up the food and deliver it to the school. Volunteers pack each bag.

Volunteers distribute the bags to the families.

Arlington Memorial High School gives us the space and refrigeration to help with this program.

Our church and St. James Episcopal Church collect individually wrapped snack items to be added to the bags.
